The Conference and Program Chairs invite all those working in areas related to IR to submit original research contributions, posters, and proposals for tutorials, workshops, and demonstrations of systems.

- Cross-language Retrieval, Multilingual Retrieval, Machine Translation for IR

- Web IR, Distributed IR, Digital Libraries, Search Strategies, Citation and Link Analysis
- Text Representation and Indexing, XML and Metadata
- Video and Image Access, Audio and Speech Retrieval, Music Retrieval
- Performance, Compression, Scalability, Architectures, Mobile Applications
- Interfaces, Visualization, Interactive IR, User Models, User Studies
- Natural Language Processing for IR, Summarization, Question Answering
- Information Extraction, Lexical Acquisition
- Evaluation, Building Test Collections, Experimental Design and Metrics
- Formal Models, Language Models, Fusion/Combination
- Specialized Applications of IR, including Genomic IR, IR in Software Engineering and IR for Chemical Structures

Submission Guidelines

Authors are invited to submit research papers, posters, and proposals for tutorials, workshop, and demonstrations. Research papers are not to exceed 5000 words, must contain original, previously unpublished work, and are not to be under review by other conferences or journals. Posters and demonstrations offer researchers an opportunity to present late-breaking results, significant work in progress, or original research that is best communicated in an interactive or graphical format. Mentoring Program

As part of our efforts to broaden participation, SIGIR 2003 will feature a mentoring program to assist authors with their submissions to the conference. Authors who have not previously had a full length paper accepted to SIGIR, and/or who are unsure about how to best prepare a paper for the SIGIR audience, will be able to request feedback on their

work from an experienced SIGIR author in advance of the submission deadline. Authors wishing to participate in the mentoring program should prepare a draft paper or extended abstract by October 31, 2002. For further details on the mentoring program, please see the conference website.
