## On Information Science as a Discipline William Goffman

The characteristics necessary for a body of knowledge to constitute a discipline are enumerated. It is then pointed out that what is now called information science can in no sense pass as a discipline.

The nature of a discipline which could be called information science is discussed in terms of

- 1. what kinds of problems are involved,
- what kinds of methods must be developed or employed to address these problems, and
- what kinds of applications would be expected from such a discipline.

Finally, it is speculated as to the likelihood of a discipline which could be called information science ever coming into being.
